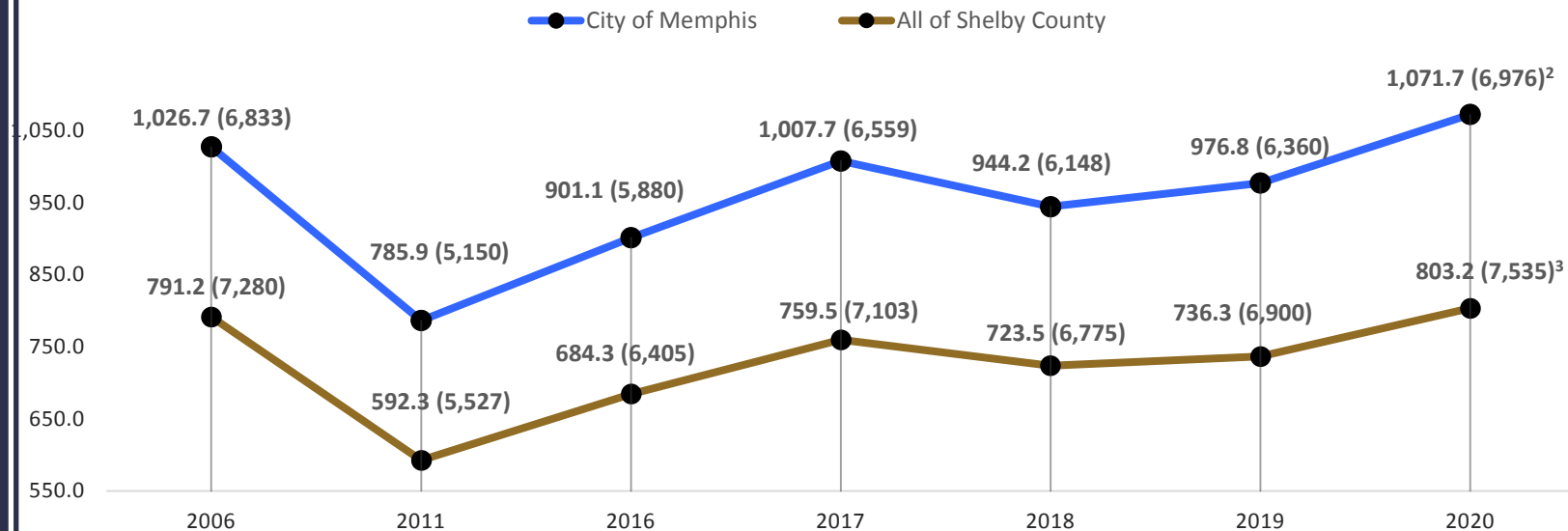

(Incidents Per 100,000 Population and Numbers)¹

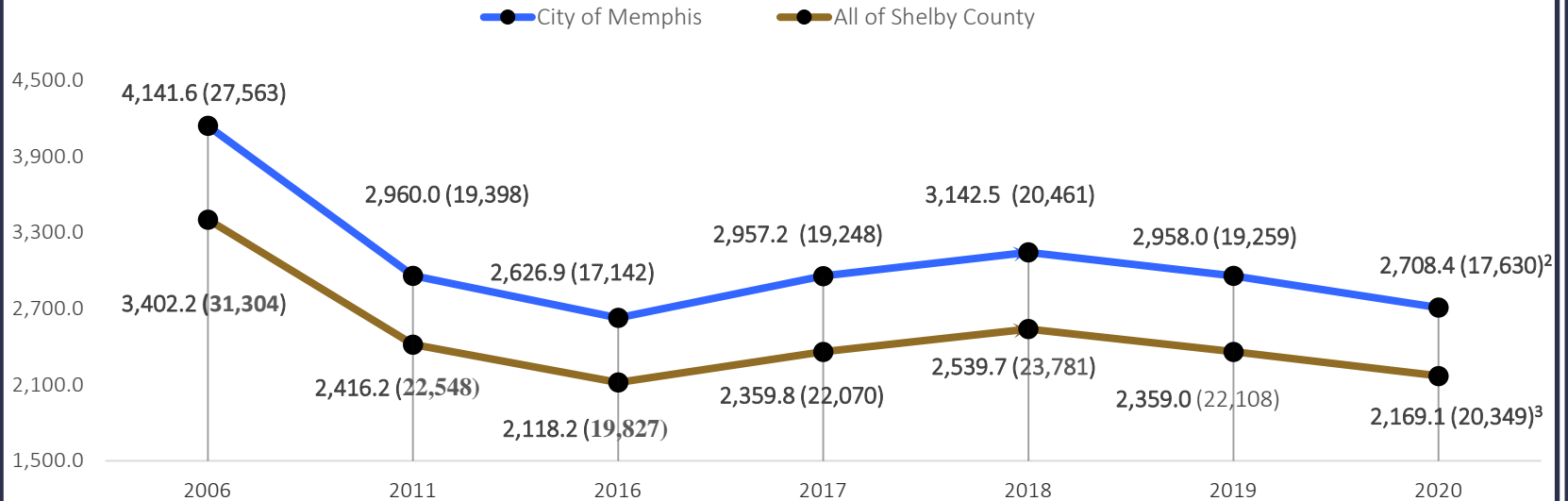

(Incidents Per 100,000 Population and Numbers)¹

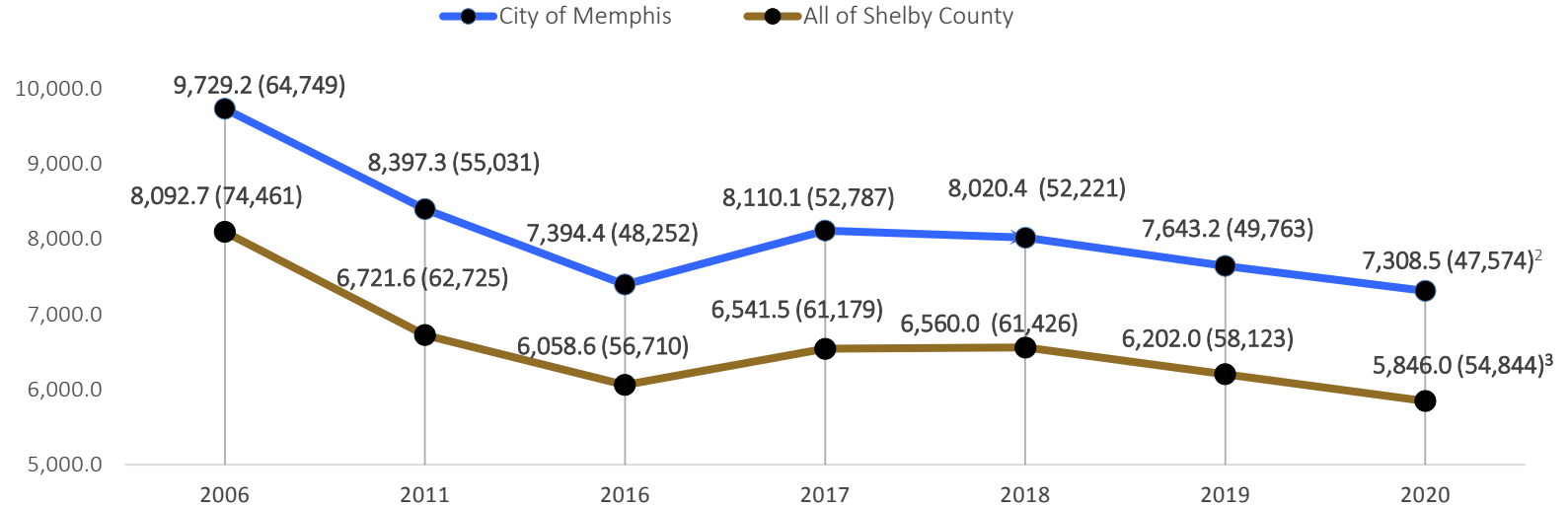

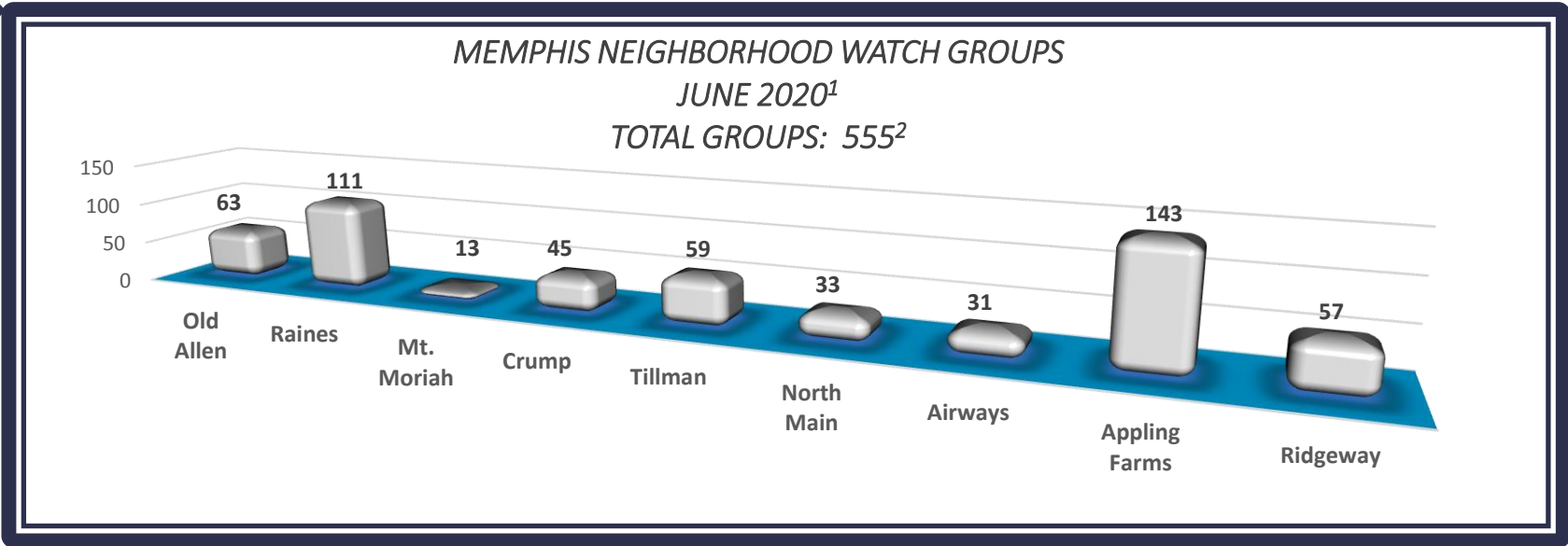

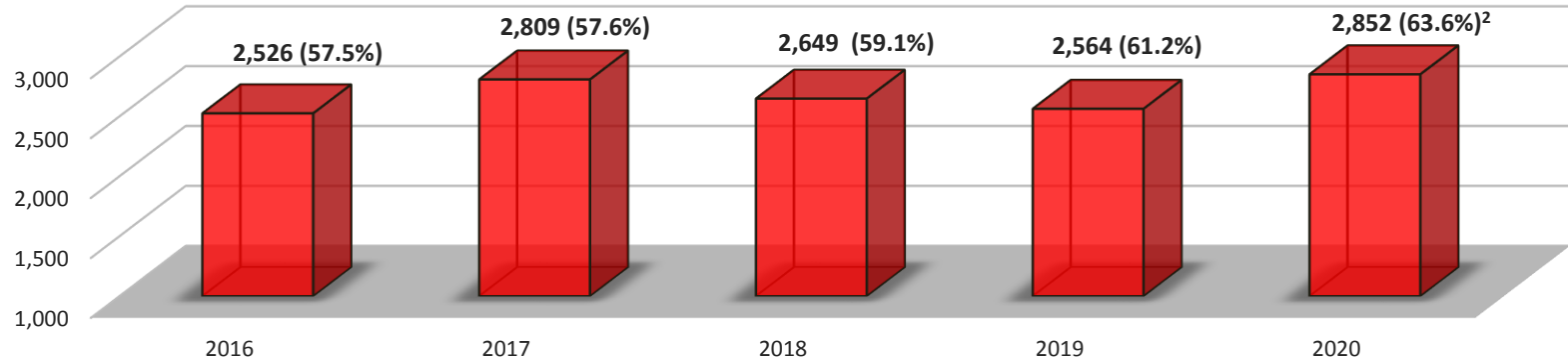

JANUARY - JUNE**

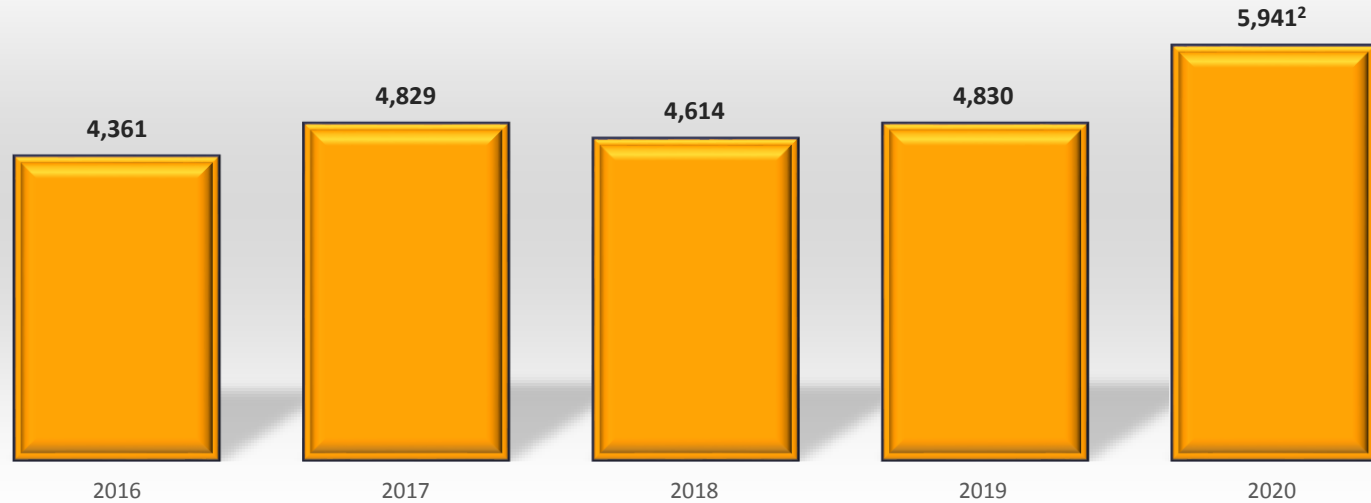

(There can be more than one offense in an incident. For example, three victims in an incident would count as three offenses.) (One incident can include multiple offenses. For example, three victims in one incident would count as three offenses.)

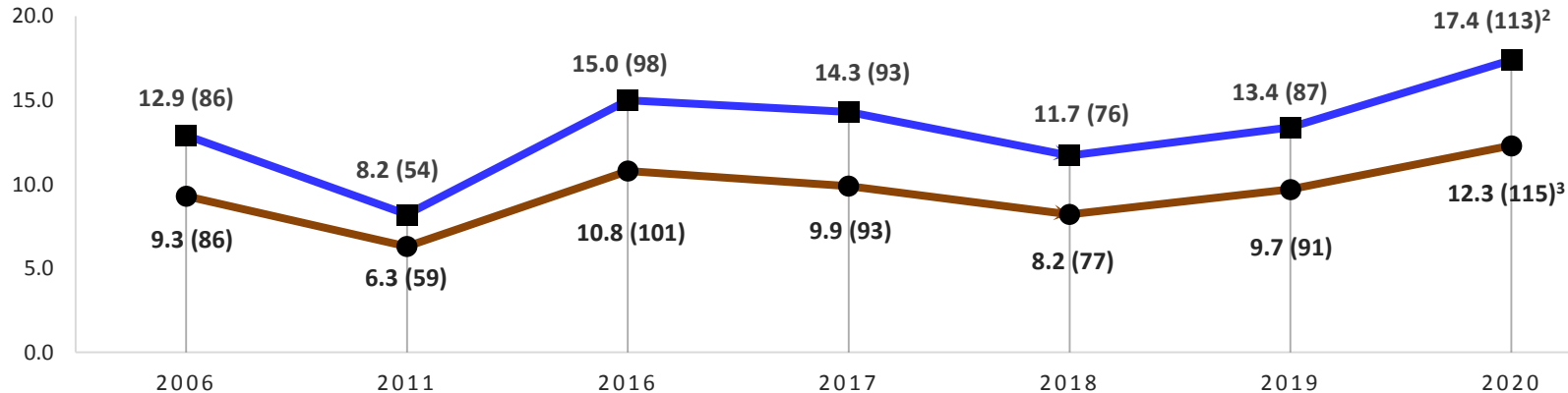

■ City of Memphis ● All of Shelby County



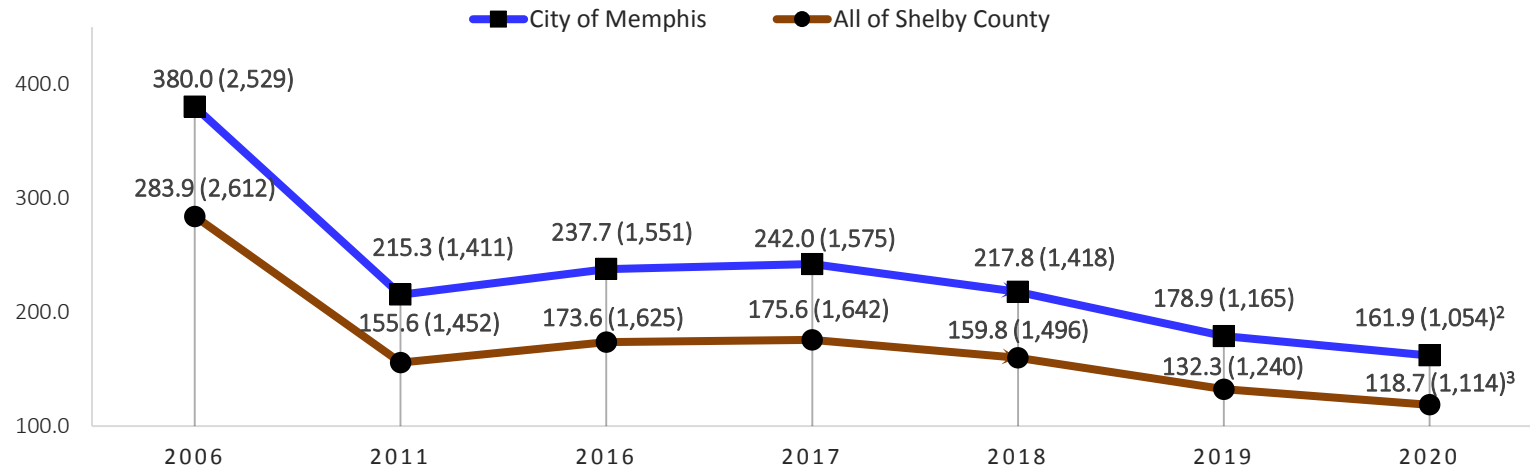

REPORTED ROBBERIES JANUARY - JUNE (RATE PER 100,000 POPULATION AND NUMBERS)¹



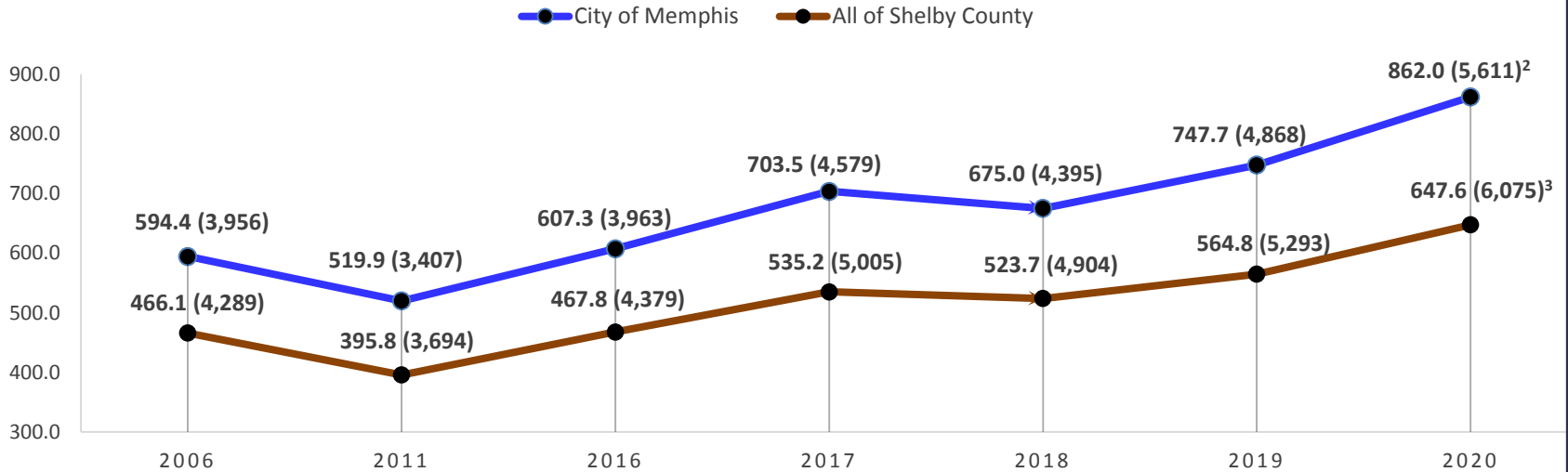

REPORTED AGGRAVATED ASSAULTS JANUARY - JUNE (RATE PER 100,000 POPULATION AND NUMBERS)¹



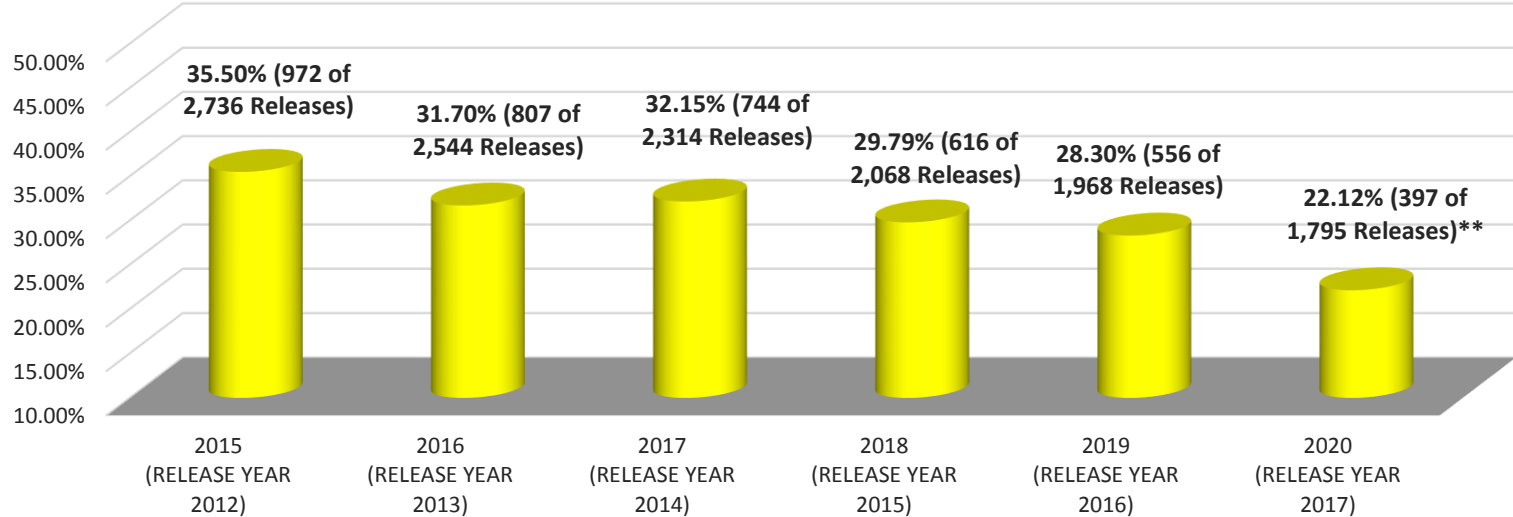

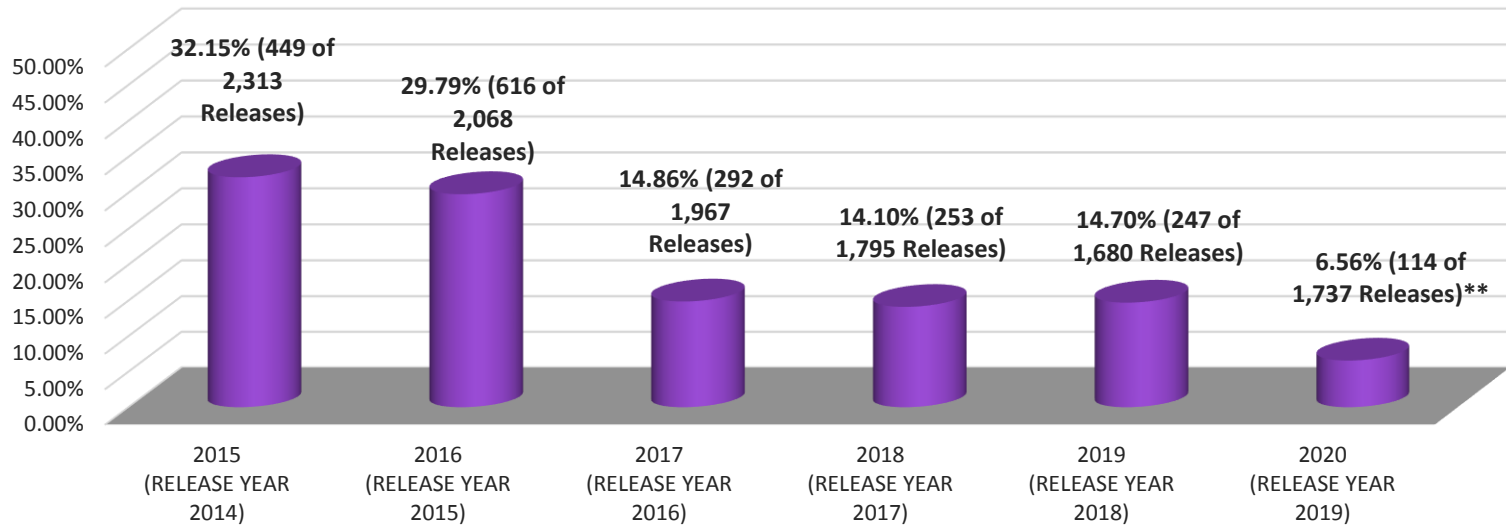


* Recidivism is defined as the percentage of convicted felony inmates who are re-incarcerated within three years of the year in which they were released from incarceration in a county facility or Department of Correction facility. For example, the 2018 recidivism rate is the percentage of inmates released in calendar 2015 who had been re-incarcerated by the end of calendar year 2018.

** The 2020 figures includes only those incarcerated within two years of release. A final figure will not be available until the end of 2020. Source: TN Department of Correction.

SHELBY COUNTY'S RETURN RATE FOR FELONY INMATES RELEASED FROM INCARCERATION* JANUARY - JUNE 2020



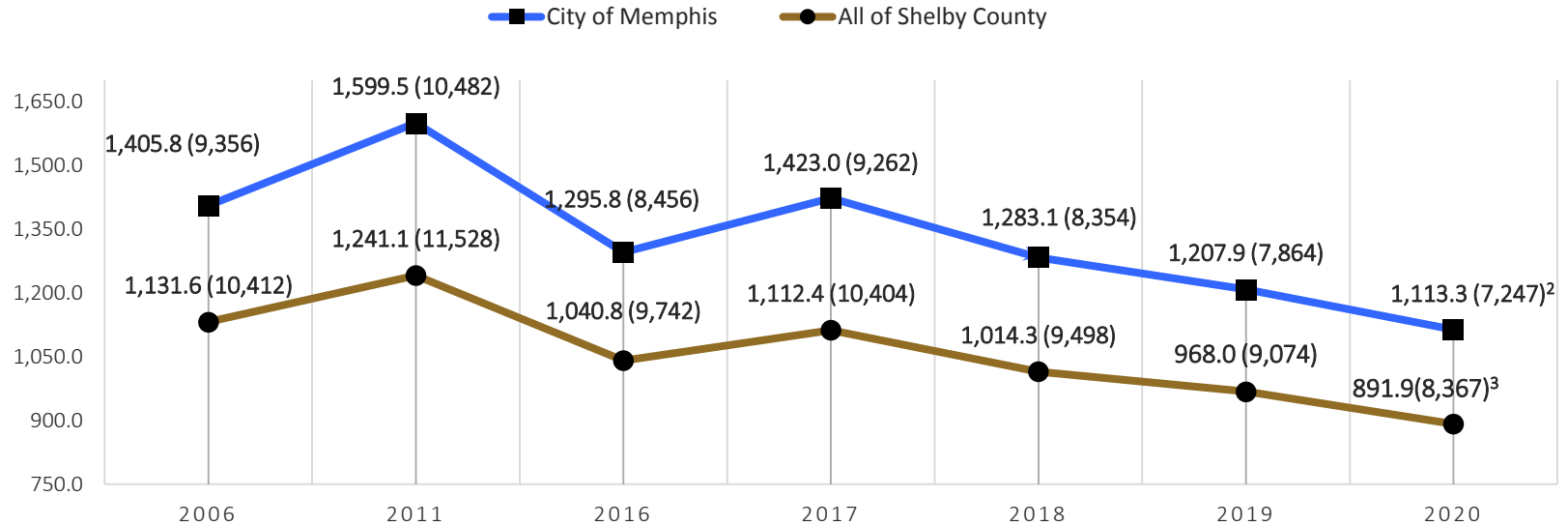

(RATE PER 100,000 POPULATION AND NUMBERS)¹**



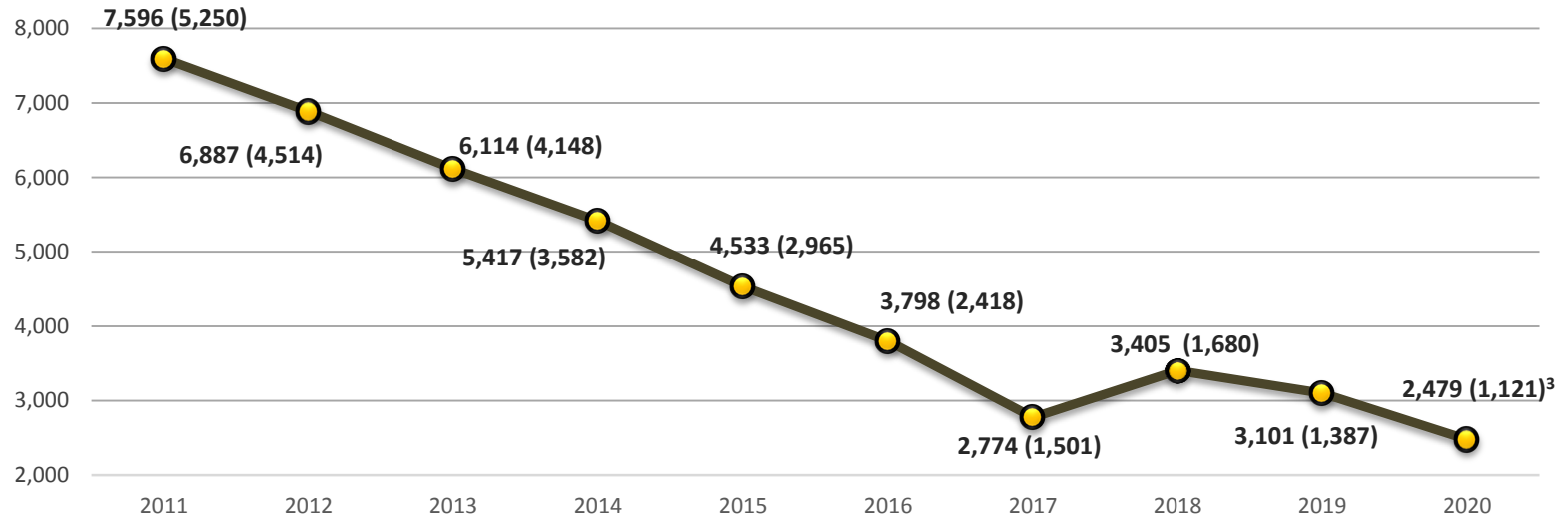

(Number of charges and number of distinct juveniles charged)



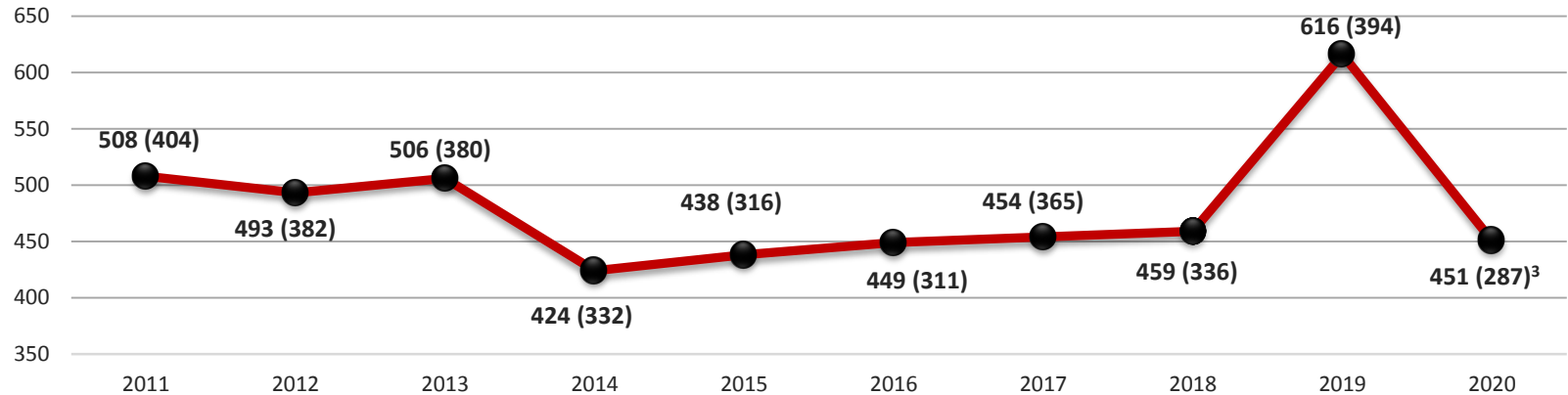
¹ "Delinquent" cases are the same as "criminal" cases against an adult (18 years or older). They include both felonies and misdemeanors.

- ¹ “Serious delinquent charges” include aggravated arson, aggravated assault, aggravated burglary, aggravated kidnapping, especially aggravated kidnapping, aggravated rape, aggravated rape of a child, aggravated riot, aggravated robbery, especially aggravated robbery, carjacking, murder, rape, rape of a child, an attempt to commit any of the aforementioned acts, reckless endangerment with a weapon, and vehicular homicide.
- ² Source: Juvenile Court of Memphis and Shelby County. Previously, the Crime Commission reported on “major violent delinquent charges” and used those categories of delinquent data most resembling those categories making up the “major violent crime” definition used by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation. The Crime Commission is now using the Juvenile Court’s definition of “serious delinquent charges,” which includes most of the same categories used previously but with some modifications.
- ³ A 9.2 percent decrease in charges compared to 2011, a .05 percent increase compared to 2016, and a 26.8 percent decrease compared to 2019.
