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
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Violent Crime Up, Property Crime Down

The University of Memphis Public Safety Institute and the Memphis Shelby Crime Commission have released crime figures for the first quarter of 2021 (January – March) compared to previous years, based on preliminary figures from the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI).

The major violent crime rate increased significantly during the first quarter of 2021 compared to last year. (Major violent crime includes murders, rapes, robberies and aggravated assaults.) In Memphis, the rate increased 24.7% compared to 2020, and the increase was 22.6% countywide.


The robbery rate actually dropped significantly (down 24.0% in Memphis and 23.8% countywide), as did reported rapes (down 37.6% in Memphis and 40.3% throughout the county). However, the murder and aggravated assault rates increased. Murders increased 30.4% in Memphis compared to the first quarter of last year (and 38.3% countywide). The overall increase in the violent crime rate was the result of alarming increases in reported aggravated assaults. – up 41.1% in Memphis and 38.0% throughout Shelby County.

The violent crime rate is determined by adding together the number of murders, rapes, robberies and aggravated assaults. Whether the rate goes up or down is driven largely by aggravated assaults because of the sheer number. For example, during the first quarter of 2021, there were 3,481 reported major violent crimes in Memphis, of which 2,926 were reported aggravated assaults.

Most aggravated assaults involve use of guns. During the first quarter of this year, the number of reported violent incidents in Memphis involving guns increased 30.1% compared to the first quarter of 2020. Equally disturbing is that almost 70% of all reported violent incidents in Memphis involved guns compared to less than 60% during the first quarter of last year.

While violent crime continues to be the major challenge, major property crime continues a downward trend. (Major property crime includes reported burglaries, motor vehicle thefts and other felony thefts.) In Memphis, the major property crime rate dropped 14.8% compared to the first quarter of last year and declined 13.3% countywide.


MAJOR PROPERTY CRIME JANUARY - MARCH Incidents Per 100,000 Population (and Numbers)¹

This decrease continues to be driven by the drop in reported burglaries, down 29.1% in Memphis and 22.3% countywide. (Reported motor vehicle thefts were actually up, while other felony thefts were down.)

The TBI measures overall crime as well based on 54 separate categories of crime. For the first quarter of the year, the overall crime rate dropped 5.8% in Memphis and 5.2% countywide.



"Aggravated assaults are driving our violent crime rate and, more specifically, driving the increase in gun crime. Many aggravated assaults involve victims actually being hit by gunfire, and, of course, an aggravated assault with a gun can easily turn into a murder," said Bill Gibbons, executive director of the Public Safety Institute and president of the Crime Commission.

Mayor Strickland's selection to head up the Memphis Police Department (Chief C.J. Davis of Durham, North Carolina) has noted the importance of focusing on reducing the number of aggravated assaults in Memphis.

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About the Crime Statistics: In measuring overall crime rates and trends, the Memphis Shelby Crime Commission and the Public Safety Institute use data reported by local enforcement agencies to the Tennessee Incident Based Reporting System (TIBRS), which was developed and is maintained by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation. An incident is defined in TIBRS as "one or more offenses committed by the same offender or group of offenders acting in concert, at the same time and place." Certain types of violent crimes and domestic violence offenses, however, uniquely refer to a victim count versus an incident count. All rates are calculated based on per 100,000 population.

About the Memphis Shelby Crime Commission (www.memphiscrime.org): The Memphis Shelby Crime Commission is an independent, non-profit 501(c) (3) organization that "quarterbacks" the work of the Safe Community Plan and its partners. It is funded through the generous contributions of many private sector donors. Ben Adams, chairman emeritus of Baker Donelson law firm, serves as chair of the board, and Bill Gibbons serves as president of the Commission.
